

2022-2023 IAMRA Membership and Programs Committee Charge

The Membership and Programs Committee reports to the Board and operates under the following charge.

1. The Membership and Programs Committee will assist the Board to achieve IAMRA's Goals* as set by the Board.
2. The Membership and Programs Committee's work program will include, but not be limited to the membership-related objectives and targets set by the Board with a goal of expanding IAMRA's membership, partnerships and impact, and increasing value to members. Currently, these objectives and targets are as follows:
 - Goal 1 a) Understand member needs and expectations of IAMRA in the current environment, as well as the utilization and impact of IAMRA's written resources.
Target:
 - i. A single, detailed membership survey
 - Goal 1 e) With reference to the Board's Communications and Engagement Strategy, increase IAMRA membership, particularly directed towards:
Targets:
 - i. developing MRAs
 - ii. established MRAs with models of regulation not based on the UK and 'colonial' model
 - iii. partner membership, particularly regulators of other professions and those involved in medical education and training
3. The Membership and Programs Committee will also advise the Board on any other matters it considers to be relevant to the pursuit of IAMRA's Vision, Goals and Objectives.
4. The Membership and Programs Committee will provide regular reports to the Board and a report to the Members General Assembly.

*IAMRA's current Goals, are as follows:

1. Creating a global community of medical regulators by expanding IAMRA's membership, partnerships and impact, and increasing value to members;
2. Supporting and encouraging members to provide, in the interest of the public, regulatory practices and systems that strive for best practice and contribute to the provision of safe and effective health care by the medical profession;
3. Leveraging technology, i) in pursuit IAMRA's purpose, including the sharing of fitness to practice/disciplinary information among IAMRA members; and ii) guiding members on the adoption of technology in regulation and healthcare.
4. Strengthening the evidence base for regulation by encouraging research and evaluation of regulatory processes, and the publication and sharing of findings.
